


In Ancient Greece, πρᾶξις (Praxis) described an activity involving free men.

The University was the first in the South East Asian region to make a mandatory requirement for students to undergo a compulsory Co-op programme that required them to obtain at least two months of internship experience at the end of each academic year, regardless of their discipline.

The pioneering move was swiftly replicated by other providers and to stay ahead, UCSI University constantly added to the programme's appeal. Today, the University has around 1,100 Co-op partners and our students consistently find employment at top multinational companies. Employers constantly give us feedback and they are delighted with the calibre of our graduates.
